# **COMMUNITY REMINDERS**

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**Refuse Bins** must be at the curb before 7am on your scheduled pick-up day, unless otherwise instructed by the community team. If desired, you may place your refuse bins at curbside after 6pm the day before collection day. The bins must be returned to proper storage by 8pm on the day of collection. Proper storage is considered along the side of the house, in the garage, in a designated storage area, or as otherwise instructed by your community team.

## **MAINTENANCE TIPS**

#### **Dishwasher Tips & Tricks**

As a part of your cleaning, it's important to do a little dishwasher maintenance. This should be completed monthly to prevent a buildup of germs. Here's a few tips to ensure that your dishwasher is running properly.

- 1.Run an empty dishwasher with white vinegar
- 2. Clean the drain to prevent clogs
- 3.Deodorize the machine by sprinkling baking soda on the bottom and running it on a half-cycle And just like that your dishwasher will be as good as new! Remember, your dishwasher is a sanitizer and not responsible for doing all the hard work.

## SAFETY TIPS

#### **Electric Vehicle Safety Tips**

- Use the right equipment: Use the manufacturer's charging cable and avoid extension cords or adapters.
- Use a proper charging system. Do not "trickle charge" through your dryer outlet.
- It is recommended to charge to 80% instead of 100% to improve battery health and longevity.
- Avoid extreme heat: High temperatures can damage your EV's battery, so park in the shade and avoid charging when it's hot.
- Have GFCI protection: Make sure you have GFCO protection to prevent electric shocks.
- Beware of your surroundings: Don't come in contact with chares while driving or parking.
- In an emergency: Call 911. Removing the auxiliary battery terminal will assist in preventing high voltage electricity from flowing.
